



I understand all CFIA projects must be publicly bid in the newspaper and by other means in order to make every effort to obtain a minimum of three bids. All projects must be reviewed by SHPO (State Historic Preservation Office) regardless of historic value of the building.				
<u> 4</u>	Quarterly Progress Reports must be received by the 20 th day of the month following the end of each quarter and also with each reimbursement request, or CFIA may, in its' discretion, withhold, suspend, or cancel any payment(s) and/or suspend or cancel this agreement.				
<u>\$\$</u>	Counties may request reimbursement up to three times during the life of this grant award. Each reimbursement request must represent the match requirement of 20% county funds and 80% CFIA funds, not to exceed the maximum amount of the grant award.				
5>	No more than 5% of the grant total may be used to reimburse for architectural and/or engineering design fees. This program is geared toward the "bricks and mortar" of projects. The CFIA does encourage the use of architects and/or engineers, though.
