The commission requested a letter stating the intent and dates the market will run and proof of insurance. The request will be placed on a future agenda for approval.





B. Opioid Settlement Funds

a. Advisory Board

There was discussion of having a well-rounded board and who could be on the Advisory Board. Commissioner Thomas suggested member/s from the DHHR, FRN, Board of Education, Sheriff's Department, Probation Office, Preston Memorial Hospital, Health Department and Health Right and a couple of At-large positions open to community members, with the committee consisting of perhaps 9 members.

b. CD Research

Commissioner Stone is working on gathering CD rates from local banks for the above-mentioned funds.

C. Fire Protection Fund

Nichole Larew stated she has a letter ready to be approved at the Thursday fire department meeting.

D. Courthouse Water Intrusion

Commissioner Thomas discussed the courthouse ground floor water intrusion problem, a problem that has been an issue for several years, which has become increasingly worse. He said it was not only a cosmetic issue but was also causing major damage to the courthouse foundation and has caused unhealthy working conditions for the employees.

He asked to begin conversation with the engineers from The Mills Group to research and find a solution to fix the problem. Administrator Raybeck noted a dated rough quote is already available to address the exterior problem.
