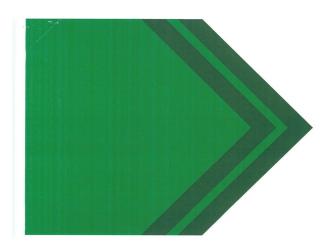

Sheriff Fields asked for approval to change a part-time position to full-time and hire three full-time utility officers as soon as possible to get them trained before the new judge comes in or at the least get them in uniform and qualified with weapons and noted he is not asking for any money because he has money in his budget to take care of it.

After some discussion on this matter and funding the Resource Officer at Preston High School, which will be discussed further during budget workshop deliberations, Commissioner Stone moved to transition the part-time utility officer position, that the sheriff already has, to full-time position with a salary of \$35,000. Commissioner Thomas seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Stone, Thomas and Smith voting yes. Motion carried.

Ms. Hillen reported on the managing of the animal shelter funds and presented reports to the commissioners on the status of the funds. Economic Growth	The second estimate of third quarter real GDP growth remained unchanged at 2.8%, aligning with the consensus forecast. While consumer spending was revised down to 3.5% from the previous estimate of 3.7%, this was offset by an increase in non-residential fixed investment, which rose to 3.8% from 3.3%. Government spending saw a healthy expansion of 5.0%, largely due to a sharp increase in defense spending, which surged by 13.9%, and state and lo cal spending, which rose by 2.7%. Net exports reduced GDP growth by 0.6 percentage points, as a significant gain in imports (+10.2%) more than offset a healthy uptickin exports (+7.5%). Overall, third quarter economic growth remained solid, driven by strong underlying domestic demand, with few signs that elevated interest rates are materially weighing on domestic activity beyond the housing market and some elements of commercial real estate.
Jobs	In November, the U.S. economy added 227,000 jobs, close to the forecast of 218,000, with revisions adding 56,000 more jobs. Despite this, civilian employment fell by 355,000, pushing the unemployment rate to 4.2%. The labor force participation rate dropped to 62.5% - a six-month low. Average hourly earnings rose by 0.4% month-on-month and 4.0% year-on-year. Aggregate hours worked increased by 0.4%. A broader sweep of the data suggests that the labor market has already come backinto better balance and is no longer a meaningful source of inflationary pressure. The labor market is stabilizing, no longer driving inflation, and the recent labor force contraction indicates a cooling market, supporting continuing potential rate cut by policymakers.
Interest Rates	The Federal Reserve Open Market Committee (FOMC) cut the target range for the federal funds rate by 25 basis points (bps), to 4.50% to 4.75%. The Fed updated its language on inflation by removing the line that it has gained "greater confidence" on inflation. Now the statement simply focuses on how the Fed views inflation risks as "roughly in balance". The announcement largely maintains the language around the state of the economy and the labor market by highlighting that "economic activity has continued to expand at a solid pace. Since earlier in the year, labor market conditions have generally eased, and the unemployment rate has moved up but remain low". The Committee would be prepared to adjust the stance of monetary policy asappropriate if risks emerge that could impede the attainment of the Committee's goals. Expectations are for 25 bps of additional cuts in December 2024 and 100 bps in 2025 to get to a neutral rate.
Inflation	The October CPI report shows inflationary progress has slowed, with inflation at 0.2% leading to year-over-year increase of 2.6% (versus 2.4% in September). Expectations were for a 0.2% increase. Energy prices were flat, as a drop in gasoline prices was offset by higher electricity costs. Excluding food and energy, core prices rose 0.3%, matching the two prior-months' gains. The twelve-month change held steady at 3.3%. Primary shelter costs rose 0.4% with a 12-month trailing increase of 5.1% down from the over 8% highs of 2023. Service inflation is continuing to look sticky hampering progress towards the Fed's 2.0% target.
Housing	Existing home sales rose by 3.4% month-on-month to an annualized rate of 3.96 million units in October, aligning closely with market expectations. This marks a 2.99 increase from a year ago, the first year-on-year gain since mid-2021. Single-family home sales were up by 3.5% and sales in the smaller condo/co-op segment rising b 2.7%. Total housing inventory continued to improve at the end of October, increasing by 0.7% from September and 19.1% from a year ago. At the current sales rat assessmally adjusted, unsold inventory stood at a 4.0 months' supply. However, the healthy momentum seen in October is unlikely to persist in the near term Mortgage rates have surged over the past several weeks and are currently hovering near 7%. Additionally, housing starts fell by 3.1% month-on-month as rising interestates and the impacts of Hurricane Milton in the southeast constrained new projects.

Comments

(+ 0.7%). U.S. consumption remains healthy on aggregate, supported by a stable labor market and solid real income gains. Personal income grew by 0.6% in October with personal consumption up 0.4% in the month. Consumer spending increased by 0.4% down from 0.6% in September with much of the gain coming from higher prices. Personal savings declined to 4.4%.

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Services continue to grow with concerns continuing in manufacturing. The Institute for Supply Management (ISM) Services PMI stayed in expansion in October with a reading of 56.0, a head of estimates of 53.8 and the last month reading of 54.9. Prices paid moved lower from 59.4 to 58.1 shows continued pricing power in services. Employment component index moved higher with a 53.0 reading undoing weaker readings in the past few months. The ISM Manufacturing Index improved to 48.4 in November from 46.5 last month. The deceleration has slowed, but a narrower segment of the industry reported growth with 3 of 18 industries growing. Demand conditions showed a notable improvement but remain soft. The new orders index rose for the fourth consecutive month, flipping backto growth (50.4). Not a bad report for the embattled manufacturing sector, with new orders now posting their first gains since March and the Fed slowly cutting interest rates there is room for optimism.

October retail sales increased 0.4% and September sales were revised higher to 0.8%. Auto sales rose 1.9% and gasoline station sales rose 0.1%. Retails sales at miscellaneous (-1.6%), furniture (-1.3%), and health and professional (-1.3%) stores were the weakest. Strong sales came from electronics (+2.3%) and food services

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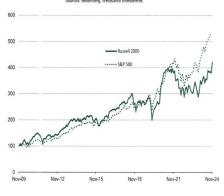

In November, the S&P 500 finished up 5.87%, led by the Consumer Discretionary, Financials, and Industrials sectors. The U.S. Presidential election on November 5^{th} kicked off the rally in equities. Since the election, the S&P 500 is up 4.44%, the NASDAQ 100 is up 3.55%, and the Russell 2000 is up 7.8%. The impact of the potential extension and/or decrease of the corporate tax cutspassed in the first Trump administration, as well as the increased domestic focus, has led to an increasing focus on U.S. small-cap stocks. Analysts are optimistic, predicting continued growth with expectations for earningsper share to rise significantly in the coming year. Neither growth or value outperformed with the Russell 1000 Value Index up 6.4% and the Russell 1000 Growth up 6.5%. International underperformed with the MSCI All-World ex US down 0.9%. .

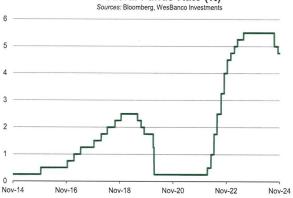
In fixed income, rates fell as the 10-year Treasury yield fell from 4.28% at October's end to 4.17% at the end of November, despite jumping to 4.43% the day after the U.S. Presidential election. The short-end of the curve rallied more significantly, with the 2-year / 10-year Treasury spread becoming inverted briefly on November $25^{\,\rm th}$ for the first time since early September. Concerns around the impacts of corporate tax cuts in combination with increased tariffs continue to drive the narrative.

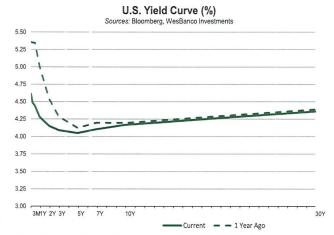

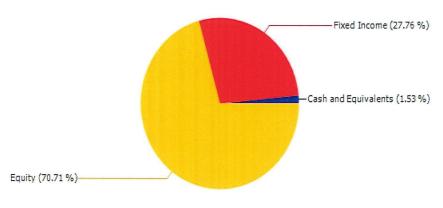
